There is money sitting at WR; we're trying to obtain the funds; even with the NNCD's help; but need to have housing plan in order. VP explains that C/O will not be utilized along with the current FY 2016 year. GO wants to have the chapter to budget the funding for him. CP: Funding from WR is already approved on the line item; 2016 money is already earmarked. He said this is similar to given a dollar and told not to spend it on candy; this is how the allocation is done; we want our own community to allocate the dollar amount; and with the embezzlement done there is lack of trust and trying to gain that trust again. Isabelle Webster - elders - they are not spoken about, why don't we make that a priority. It seems like it is me, me, me, and why don't we put some for this and that, we need to help. How is this operating? Why is the CSC not here? You need to work together. Audit had been requested; CP indicates that it is frustrating to want to help elders; and help with other things like chop wood; etc. What you talking about you need to contact WR; if we do not abide by NNC - T26 we will be in jail. It is time to help ourselves; just to come to the meeting; Sunday, we waited 2 hours - ... How are you going to help Cameron? L Hosteen question is satisfied by CP. Mae Franklin - wants to amend the budget; and CP indicates that the fund is already earmarked. VP - feels that the definitions to be taught to the community; and all processes be explains from the CSC and S/T. Request training one day to the community, and you are the community that needs to know - S/T needs to explain the accounts, etc. (the fund types are given in paper format, and explain at the chapter meeting). This is what I want to happen for you, this is the responsible of the S/T, CSC, & AMS, continued VP. Vote: 22, 0, 7
